One of the reality shows that Amy and I like to watch is “Big Brother” and the tagline for the show is “Expect the Unexpected.” I feel that, as I write this, we have had a winter of the unexpected. Incredibly warm temperatures, so much so that I have golfed in both January and February in 2024. Barely any snow. It has been a very strange winter and who knows what “spring” will bring as we enter March. But that is the thing. Life sometimes throws us the unexpected. That is what makes life such a joy and also can make it so difficult. Things don’t always go how we think they go or the expected way they are going to go.

Heck, you might be surprised to know that Easter is here in March. Sure, it is the last day of March, but we normally expect Easter in April. But here we are and here Easter comes. But the resurrection of Jesus is an unexpected event. Jesus was killed, crucified on the cross in front of lots of witnesses. No one, not even his disciples, thought he would be coming back, even though he told them he would rise from the dead. For who rises from the dead? And yet, there he was, surprising them, doing the unexpected. Defeating sin and death to rise from the dead.

That resurrection is surprising still to us this day, even though we know it is coming. Because there is still a part of us that can’t believe that Jesus defeats sin and death for us. We can’t believe that God loves us so much that he does this for us. We are saved? Us? Who make such stupid mistakes, who say we are going to follow God, love our neighbor, care for the needy, and so on and yet do the exact opposite time and time again? This Savior rises from the dead for us? It is just so . . . unexpected.

But that is what God does. God in Jesus Christ does the unexpected. And not only is the resurrection of Jesus Christ unexpected, but every single day the unexpected is happening for you are being given love and grace. Every single day God is calling you to discipleship and purpose. Every single day the Lord is inviting you to look at the world through different eyes, eyes that look toward the neighbor, the outsider, the poor and the forgotten, eyes that might see the new things that God is calling you to do and be.

Yes, “expect the unexpected” is the motto of a reality show. But it could also be God’s motto as well. For God did the most unexpected thing of all: God sent his only Son to die and rise to bring you to eternal life. For that we can say, “Thanks be to God!”

She sewed very little at the time, which if you see her quilts now you would never believe that. In the sewing room she sews around the quilts once they get pinned. Her sister Bea often joins us. She stays busy at home sewing tops for us to finish up on Tuesday. At the end of 2022 she has finished 1240 tops for donations. She also makes for LWR and other places that we send. Carol feels our quilting group has always been a group that has worked together and enjoyed the time spent together and has grown with the needs of the community. The people that come to the quilting on Tuesday are the most fun. She loves all the donations from people to help us meet our goals. What is so different for Carol is that when the quilters first started, she understood they often used material that had been sewed together as items to wear. It was taken apart, ironed, and used in quilts. Quilt tops were pieced at home, often on your bed, then brought to the church to be completed. Boy, have we come along way!! She likes that now we deliver our quilts directly to the places that need or request them. Her special memories are our quilting group made a quilt for a benefit for this guy. Later, his wife was working with a group of Girl Scouts in Minnesota and had a box of Disney material that was to be dropped off at Goodwill on her way home. She said, "No way!" I have a special place for this material and that's where I want it to go! She donated that material to our quilting group, and it made 8 or 10 quilt tops to give away! 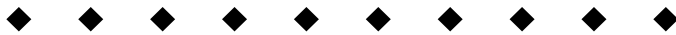

Pastor Brad Goes on Sabbatical this Summer

In 2023, Church Council approved Pastor Brad taking a sabbatical starting on Saturday, June 8th through Tuesday, July 9th. As we prepare for PB's sabbatical, below is some important information.

What is a sabbatical? A sabbatical is an intentional time away for a pastor to renew and re-charge physically, spiritually, and emotionally. A sabbatical for a pastor is dedicated to time with God so that the pastor may be refreshed by the Spirit and grow in love for God, God's church, and God's people.

How often does a pastor take a sabbatical? The ELCA recommends that a pastor take a three-month sabbatical every seven years of ministry. Pastor Brad will have served Trinity 22 years in August of this year, and this will be his first sabbatical, which is only lasting about five weeks.

How will PB spend his sabbatical? Pastor Brad can spend it however he wants. He intends to do some traveling with Amy and spend a lot of time not working, which is his favorite hobby. No doubt you will find him on the golf course a lot when he is in town! He intends the time away a chance to get refreshed, renewed, and re-energized as a pastor.

Who will lead worship in Pastor Brad's absence? Pastor Brad has arranged for all worship services on Sunday and Wednesday to be served by other pastors, so there will be no cancelled or missed services.

What happens if there is an emergency? Just like when PB is on vacation, there will be an on-call pastor to take care of any pastoral care emergencies. Just contact the church office.

What will Pastor Brad's contact be with the congregation during his sabbatical? This sabbatical is meant to be a full unplugging of the congregation for Pastor Brad. He will not return phone calls, emails, or text messages. If you see Pastor Brad around town, he will of course have a conversation with you and greet you, but he is to be away from the church until he returns on July 10th. However, if there is a tragedy that occurs in the congregation, PB may choose to return.

Does the sabbatical replace Pastor Brad's vacation? No. PB still receives his normal vacation time.

What will the congregation need to do during the sabbatical? There are a few things that everyone at Trinity can do to help during PB's time away. They include:

Keeping Pastor Brad, Amy, and Trinity in prayer.

Volunteering your time to fill in things that Pastor Brad often does, like putting the live stream up for Sunday and Wednesday services so people can worship at home, or being willing to help as readers, greeters, or even opening and closing the building if it is needed.

Respecting Pastor Brad's boundaries during his time away. The less you contact him, the better it will be. The church will publish who you can contact with questions or if you need something. When in doubt, contact the church office.

Continue to support the church with your financial gifts, your attendance at worship, and your service to our mission and ministry in the world!

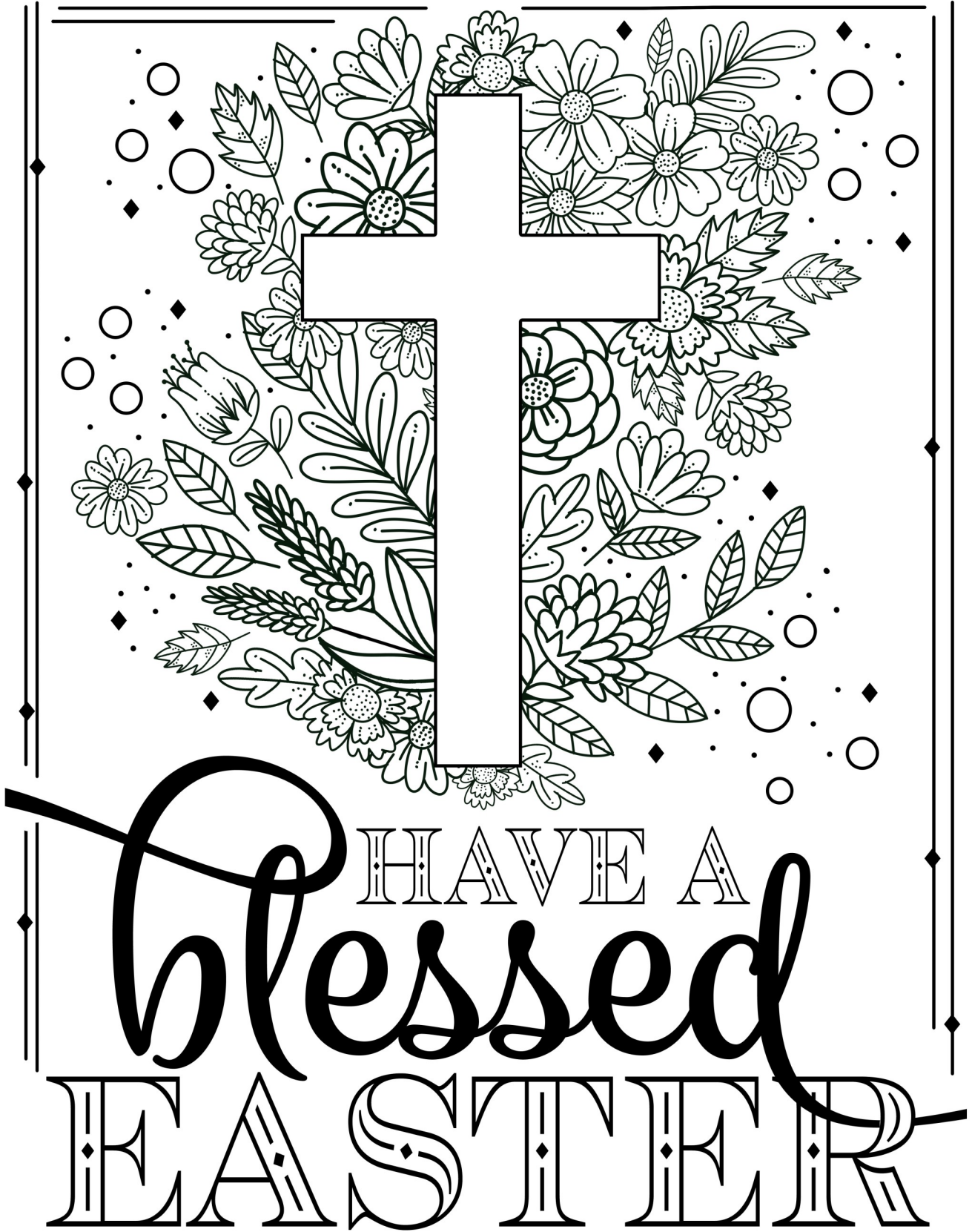

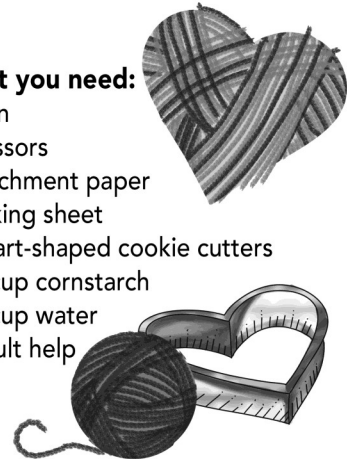

Make this heartfelt craft as a decoration or gift.

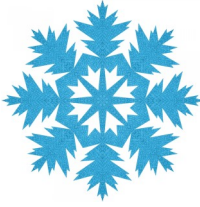
What you need:

- Yarn
- Scissors
- Parchment paper
- Baking sheet
- Heart-shaped cookie cutters
- ¼ cup cornstarch
- ½ cup water
- Adult help

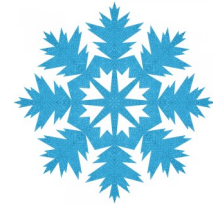


What you do:

1. Cut yarn into 12-inch pieces.
2. Place cookie cutters atop a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.
3. Combine cornstarch and water in a saucepan. Heat mixture over medium heat, stirring until thick and smooth. Remove from heat and cool to form a "glue."
4. Dip each piece of yarn into the mixture to coat completely. Squeeze off any excess.
5. Place yarn in the cookie cutters, allowing pieces to cross and loop within the heart. Add more until the cookie cutter is filled and the yarn looks like a heart.
6. Remove cookie cutters and bake the sheet for two hours at 150°F, or until hearts are dry and hard.
