Who, What, When, How, and Why of the Trinity Lutheran Church Confirmation Program 2024-2025

- What: Confirmation is a program of Trinity Lutheran Church involving a partnership between parents, youth, and Trinity Lutheran Church for instruction in the Christian faith and in fulfillment of the promises made by the parents and the church at the baptism of their child.
- Who: Confirmation involves the parents and youth in 7th and 8th grade along with the Pastor.
- When: Confirmation is on Wednesday evenings from 5:30 pm till 6:30 pm at Trinity. We alternate grades every other week (see schedule for specifics)
- **How:** Youth will be instructed in the Christian faith through lectures, activities, service both inside and outside the church, memory work, and faith experiences like camp and recharge.

Basic Info

- <u>Absences</u>-All absences must be excused through a parent or guardian either by phone, email, or a note. If a student is in school that day, they are expected to attend class that night. An excused absence from a Wednesday class includes illness, family emergency, death in the family, or pre-arranged absence due to family vacation. SPORTING EVENTS WILL NOT BE COUNTED AS AN EXCUSED ABSENCE.
- Parents are invited to be part of the confirmation class!
- <u>Food is allowed in class.</u> We ask that you do not bring popcorn. Students may bring a beverage to class. Food may be restricted if it is abused or becomes a distraction.
- <u>Materials</u>-each student should have a Bible, notebook, pen/pencil. A folder will be provided. If they don't have a Bible, please let PB know and one will be provided. Students can store materials in the confirmation room.
- <u>Folders</u> are used to store all confirmation work. Upkeep of the folder is the responsibility of the confirmand. All needed forms are in the confirmation room.

FELLOWSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

- Fellowship is the main fundraiser for confirmation students and pays for lock-ins, recharge, and supplies.
- Cheese and coffee are provided by Trinity Youth.
- Please bring enough to serve about 100 people. Most of the time you will be doing fellowship with another family. Please communicate with each other on who is bringing what. PB will let you know in advance if there is a special Sunday that needs to be taken into consideration.
- Fellowship is what you make it. It can be as big and elaborate as you want or it can be simple with just a few items.
- There may be items that can be used for fellowship in the Trinity pantry. If they are unmarked they are fair game. Talk to PB if you are unsure.
- Upon arrival, begin to make coffee in the Bunn coffee pot and in the smaller pot on the counter. There are instructions posted by the single sink. Coffee might already be on for you depending on the Sunday. If you need help, ask anyone that is in the fellowship hall before church.
- Coffee can be found underneath that sink. Filters are in the drawer next to that sink.
- Cheese is in the white fridge for you to cut up.
- All drawers and cabinets are labeled to help you find items.
- Please, whenever possible, use regular plates and cups. DO NOT USE PAPER PRODUCTS UNLESS YOU ARE PROVIDING THEM.
- If you have concerns regarding fellowship or need anything, please talk with PB.

AFTER FELLOWSHIP IS COMPLETED

- Wash all dishes, dry, put away.
- Wipe down all tables.
- Count fellowship money, place in envelope, give to usher, Becky Nyhus, Herb Dow, or PB. Please make sure the date is on it.
- Wipe down kitchen counters and appliances.
- Check to make sure the coffee pots are empty and OFF.
- Turn off lights.
- Please take all dirty towels and washcloths home to clean and bring back.
